I am sending in *Stars & Stripes* (Air Edition) from 2JUL65 (the day after the sapper attack) which I cut out and kept, describing the attack on Da Nang. It states in the opening that one Air Policeman, standing guard near the south end of the field, was killed when the suicide squad sprayed his post with small arms fire. I was surprised at how yellow the headline article came out. Guess something 43 years old is going to show it's age. *Not like you and I!*

Also have some pictures from the *Bangkok Post* of the damaged and destroyed aircraft. Since these are old newspaper articles and obviously in delicate condition, I will send a copy. I don't have a scanner and am new to the computer. Also, have not gotten to my slides out yet as job search is "Number One" at the present time. By the way, my best buddies are Marines and am looking forward to possibly becoming an associate member of their local shooting team.

> The base, 385 miles north of Saigon, is used by the U.S. Air Force for many of the bombing raids against communist north Victorian and for support attacks against Vict Cong ground raids in the area. The base and the nearby city of Da Kang have been protected-since March by the 3d U.S. Marine Amphibious Force, which numbers about 15,-000 men.

MILLION DAMAGE TO US AIRCRAFT

DA NANG, Vietnam, Thursday A small communist suicide squad raced into the vital Da Nang a.r base


raced into the vital Da Anng air base early today and used hand grenades to destroy three American planes. Under cover of a mortar harrage, the Viet Cook killed one air policeman and damaged several planes. Five other Americans were awarded slightly during the attack.

Use air policemen, standing grand near the confi-me of the field, was folled when the squad sprayed his post with small arms fire.

The attackers disserved two US Air Force C-150 Herrales transport planer and one F 102 jet figlden. the: other flavoulet transport and two atour F-102s were damaged.

MORTAR FIRE

American authorities at first believed the planes had been destroyed by the moster fire. But investigation proved the Vist Cong squad penetrated the much-vaunted defenses of the base to pitch their grenades.

Sirens at the base wailed as soon as the first moster bit the south end of the siretrip at about 1:30 a.m.

From a position between the base and the southern limits of the defence perimeter, the guerrilles poured 27 rounds of 81mm shells onto the edge of the survey.

The squad withdrew while American creamen scrambfod from their tent and trailers surrounding the aircraft.

The mostars landed with deadly socuracy, disintegrating one Delta Dagger jet. Cockpits on the other two jets were damaged heavily. Some 25 US pilots and crewmen were sleeping in

Some 25 US pilots and crewmen were sheeping in trailers and tents near the planes at the tip of the base's 10,000 foot long rawny. Two of the pilots were reported injured by flying glass.

TURMOIL

The mortar attack threw the base into a state of turmoil. Most personnel within the base were alorping, but maintenance crews were awake. Flares lit up the sky most of the night over the base as reconnaissance planes huzzed the sky on the lookout for possible enemy troop movements.

Only 90 miles (144km) from the North Vietnamore border the base has been considered a prime target of the Viet Cong since the United States began air strikes against North Vietnamore Congress of the Vietnamore

nam in February. The base is located about two miles (3.2 km) from Da Nang city, South Victorius's second largest tity with a population of 150,000.

SWEEP

US Marine and Vietnumess forces launched a big sweep at dawn through the area from which the morter fire appeared to have

Four of the jets excepted damage, and were moved to the centre of the runway during the ourly morning. Within four and one half hours after the harrage, three new Fl02 jets were flown to Da Nang as replacements.
