Throneburg injuries, shot in the left shoulder

NEMO A534 injuries, shot in the left side of his face and the bullet exited near his right eye.

NEMO A534 was the first sentry dog to be sent home to the states from Vietnam. He became a goodwill ambassador for the remainder of his life. He died Mar 15, 1973.

The Nemo's War Dog Heros Association was formed and took it upon themselves to find Nemo's old growl pad at Lackland AFB, TX.
