

### Vietnam Security Police Association 26th Reunion Colorado Springs, Colorado – October 6-10, 2021 United States Air Force Academy

The 2021 VSPA reunion will be held at the HOTEL ELEGANTE, located at 2886 S Circle Drive, Colorado Springs, CO 80906. The contract room rate is \$135 per night, plus tax for one or two people, \$145 for three people, \$155 for four people. The room rate includes a hot breakfast (for TWO) with an additional fee of \$10 per person for breakfast for a third or fourth person in the room, as shown. The rooms include a refrigerator. The room rate is locked-in; however, for the three days before and three days after the reunion, the room rate is based upon room availability. You must book early to ensure that rooms are available. DON'T WAIT! Complimentary airport transportation is available to and from COLORADO SPRINGS MUNICIPAL AIRPORT ONLY. The airport in Denver is 55 miles away and has shuttle service available for a separate fee. Hotel SELF-parking is FREE. RV Parking is subject to a charge of \$35 per night. HOTEL RESERVATIONS: Call Phone toll-free 1-800-981-4012 by Sunday September 5, 2021. You must identify yourself as a member of the Vietnam Security Police Association or reference Group reservation #2739313. All reservations must be guaranteed and accompanied by a first night room deposit or guaranteed with a major credit card. The deadline for reservations is September 5, 2021.

After that date, rooms will be space available only and AT THE HOTEL'S PREVAILING RATE.

Make your reservations early! Check-in time is 3:00 PM and check-out time is 11:00 AM. If you encounter any difficulty with hotel reservations, reserve the room, obtain the confirmation number and contact the Reunion BRAT at 1-360-663-2521. Explain the problem and she will correct it for you.

# ROOMS IN THE AREA WILL GO FAST DUE TO AN ACADEMY CLASS REUNION AND A FOOTBALL GAME AT THE ACADEMY!!! MAKE YOUR RESERVATIONS EARLY!!!

Our hotel has been inspected TWICE! The first-inspection occurred last year by VSPA Life Member Jim Costello and his wife Angie. They live locally and stated that the hotel is large and beautiful. The second inspection just occurred, was highly detailed, including contract space verifications and a stay in the hotel by VSPA Vice President Larry Fleming and his wife, Martha. Their report was OUTSTANDING! The Fleming and Costello families have attended numerous VSPA reunions and know our requirements in detail.

We conducted a survey of members who attended our last reunion in Washington, D.C. We have spoken with many of our members about fatigue and the length of time for our tours. Members who attended our last two reunions expressed concern regarding early start times, as well as fatigue and the extended day while on base. More and more of our members have difficulty walking; however, some walking may be required on Friday due to the Academy facility. Therefore, our planning for events will reduce walking time at the Academy. The tour on Thursday is a shopping tour for the Sisterhood and will necessarily include some walking. They will also have a bus tour of The Garden of the Gods. Our goal is to provide an opportunity for a reunion with less physical demands and more time to visit with each other.

Our registration fee DECREASED this year! The REGISTRATION FEE will be \$190 per person. For comparison purposes, the registration fee for our 2019 reunion in Washington, D.C. was \$210 because it is our most expensive venue. We always work hard to control cost and sincerely hope that the registration fee is not something that will impact your ability to attend our reunion. The registration fee includes an EARLY BIRD CREDIT of \$25 for those who have a registration postmarked by September 3.

THE FOLLOWING IS A CRITICAL CHANGE TO OUR REUNION REGISTRATION PROCESS. PLEASE READ!

The Reunion BRAT and your VSPA Board of Directors experienced severe impact on planning and preparation FOR THE 2019 REUNION by <u>late and incomplete registrations</u> that were received long past the deadline.

The impact on the Reunion BRAT and the 2019 REUNION was founded on the long standing VSPA requirement that she prepare the Entry Authorization List that we submit to the base. Andrews

AFB needed that list so that they could check each name for valid entry. That database also affected the Reunion BRAT's ability to create name badges, work with the hotel on meal requirements, room availability, handle last minute additions, assist members with cancellations due to medical issues, and schedule buses on contract for various events based upon the number of participants that varied consistently up until the last few days. The incomplete registrations required the Reunion BRAT to track down members for additional information that was either omitted, or the entire Entry Authorization Data Entry Form was not sent to the Reunion BRAT. In many cases, Board members had to do the tracking and contacting of members.

The impact on the VSPA Board and Reunion Planning Committee consisted of delaying plans with the base, including the meal at the base, working with outside entities who had approval authority over our ability to visit like the U.S. Capitol, Arlington National Cemetery and multiple units at Joint Base Andrews. A variety of other problems occurred we had to resolve on behalf of our members by contacting them for the Reunion BRAT.

WHEN THIS INFORMATION WAS PRESENTED TO THE MEMBERSHIP DURING THE ANNUAL BUSINESS MEETING, THEY UNANIMOUSLY AGREED THAT THIS PROBLEM MUST BE CORRECTED FOR ALL FUTURE REUNIONS DUE TO THE LAST MINUTE WORKLOAD FOR ALL INVOLVED WITH PLANNING AND COORDINATING A SUCCESSFUL REUNION. THEREFORE, WE ARE IMPLEMENTING AN EARLY BIRD CREDIT ON YOUR REGISTRATION OF \$25 IF YOUR REGISTRATION IS POSTMARKED BY SEPTEMBER 3. FOR REGISTRATIONS POSTMARKED AFTER THAT DATE, THE REGISTRATION FEE WILL INCREASE BY \$25. THIS WAS APPROVED BY ACCLIMATION OF ALL ATTENDEES.

#### INSTRUCTIONS FOR COMPLETING THE REGISTRATION FORMS

- 1. The information that you provide on this form is critical for a successful reunion. All name and base information will be placed on your reunion identification badge. Guests will also receive reunion identification. The reunion ID will serve as your identification throughout the reunion and must be worn, especially while we are in all military or government facilities.
- 2. PLEASE PRINT or type all information clearly. Do not use abbreviations on any portion of the registration form.
- 3. RVN OR THAI BASE INFORMATION: Please list only those bases where you served in Vietnam or Thailand. When listing bases, do not abbreviate. When listing squadrons, please indicate Air Police, Security Police, or specific detachments. The information will be used on your reunion ID.
- 4. HOME ADDRESS and MAILING ADDRESS: for your confirmation letter. THE CONFIRMATION LETTERS WILL BE MAILED BY SEPTEMBER 15, 2021.
- 5. TELEPHONE AND EMAIL ADDRESS: Your contact information is vital to a successful reunion. You will also receive a copy of the attendee roster upon arrival at the hotel.
- 6. NAMES OF YOUR GUESTS: Please provide the first name, middle initial and last name of your guest(s) on the Registration Form.
- 7. RENEWAL OF ANNUAL DUES: For existing VSPA members only you can renew your dues at the time of registration if they are not current. VSPA membership must be current in order to attend the reunion or bring a guest. Life Members have paid their dues for life.
- 8. VSPA MEMBERSHIP: If you are not a member of the Vietnam Security Police Association, please do not send \$15 with this registration form. For information on how to become a member, contact Paul Shave at 505-831-9401 or email him: Paul Shave@hotmail.com. You will have to submit a completed application form and a DD-214 showing service in the USAF as an Air Policeman, Security Policeman or an Augmentee in Vietnam or Thailand 1958 to 1976, and a discharge under honorable conditions.
- 9. REUNION COST: The registration fee is \$190 per person UNLESS YOU MISS THE EARLY BIRD DEADLINE WITH A POSTMARK OF SEPTEMBER 3. The registration fee will be \$215 per person for all registrations postmarked after September 3. THIS IS CRITICAL because of the work that must be completed by the Reunion BRAT and your Board of Directors. The following work must be completed by the Reunion BRAT after registrations are received: A full audit of all names, base names, squadrons and fees paid. The audit of names must be correct in order to print reunion ID badges, develop the Entry Authorization List for the Security Forces personnel at the Academy, and pay advance fees to the hotel and bus transportation company based upon the number of people attending the reunion. Only then can the confirmation letters be mailed to our members. All of the registration and identification information must be assembled in Registration Welcome Packages that have to be mailed in bulk to the hotel with enough time for delivery no later than Tuesday, October 5, the day before registration opens at the hotel. Shipping and delivery is very difficult to guarantee with the current delays in mail systems and shipping. Once the packages arrive at the hotel, another audit must take place so that reunion specific items may be placed in each welcome package, including reunion pins, patches, meal tickets, bus tickets, raffle information and local restaurant information. PLEASE DON'T DELAY.

### 2021 ELECTION OF VSPA OFFICERS CALL FOR BIOS AND PHOTOS

The VSPA's By-Laws call for elections of officers every two years, with all current members being given an opportunity to vote. Current members may vote in person by attending the business meeting at the annual reunion, or by mailing in a written ballot, which will be printed in the next issue of Guardmount. Each member may submit only one ballot. There are six positions up for election: President, Vice President, Second Vice President, Secretary, Treasurer and Historian. The other positions on our board of directors (President Emeritus, Past President and Communications Director) are permanent positions as recognized by our Constitution and By-Laws. All other positions in the VSPA are staff positions appointed by the president and board based upon expertise and willingness to serve the members of the VSPA. Elected officers will be confirmed and installed after the voting is completed at the reunion in October. The term of office of all positions is two years. The positions do not receive a salary and are entirely on a volunteer basis.

VSPA members have until **August 13, 2021** to declare their intention to run for an elected VSPA position and must submit a bio and photo for publication in Guardmount. Each person who runs must have been a regular member or life member in good standing for at least two years prior to the election. Board members must have the ability to attend future business meetings that are held at our annual reunions. They must communicate via the Internet and by phone on a regular basis, and must make the commitment to provide the time necessary to serve in the position - none of these are ceremonial positions.

If you want to run for an office on the VSPA Board of Directors, you'll need to submit a photo and one-page biography. Send your bio and photo to VSPA's Guardmount Editor, Mike Kennedy, electronically (mike3sps@verizon.net) or by surface mail (14766 Foxfield Lane, Fontana, CA 92336) soon enough so that he receives your information by **August 13, 2021**. The bios and a ballot will be made available in the next issue of Guardmount.

The duties of the elected board positions below are from the VSPA By-Laws:

**PRESIDENT** - The duties of the President shall include, but not be limited to:

- **A.** Act as Chief Executive Officer and Chairman of the Board of Directors.
- **B**. Cause to be called all regular and special meetings of the organization.
- C. Preside over all regular and special meetings of the organization.
- **D**. Enforce the Constitution and By-Laws.
- **E**. Direct and supervise the operation of the organization.
- **F**. Prepare and present the Board of Directors Annual Report at the annual business meeting.
- **G**. Coordinate the confirmation of all appointed staff members with the Board of Directors.

- **H**. Keep a current folder that includes all official correspondence, records, and official materials assigned to his care and turn over the folder to his successor.
- I. Be an ex-officio member of all committees, except the "Nominations Committee."

**VICE PRESIDENT** and **SECOND VICE PRESIDENT** - The duties of the Vice President and the Second Vice President shall include, but not be limited to:

- **A**. Assist the President in the discharge of his duties.
- **B**. Assume the duties of the President in the event of his absence, illness, or call to eternal Guardmount.
- **C**. Execute the powers and authority of the President, when required, in the absence of the President.
- **D**. Serve as elected members of the Board of Directors.
- E. Serve as Chairman and member of the Public Relations Committee if a committee is necessary.
- **F**. Serve as a member of the Scholarship Committee.
- **G**. Prepare and present annual reports relative to the operation of their respective office at the annual business meeting.
- **H**. Keep a current folder that includes all official correspondence, records, and official materials assigned to their care and turn over the folder to his successor.
- I. The Second Vice President shall provide oversight for all record keeping activities and assist the President by maintaining hard copy records when necessary.

**SECRETARY** - The duties of the Secretary shall include, but not be limited to:

- A. Officiate when required in the absence of the President and Vice President.
- **B**. Serve as an elected member of the Board of Directors.
- **C**. Serve as a member of the Membership Committee.
- **D**. Be the clerk of the organization.
- **E**. Be the custodian of all business-related non-financial records and materials, with the exception of: those records which are created and maintained by the VSPA Historian, the VSPA Membership Chairman, the VSPA Treasurer and VSPA Communications Director Don L. Poss; or those records which are required for performance of the duties of the registered agent and liaison with VSPA's tax accountant and tax attorney. All such records shall remain property of the organization.
- **F**. Take minutes and keep permanent records of the proceedings of all annual Business Meetings and meetings of the Board of Directors.
- **G**. Prepare and distribute election ballots, if necessary and as required.

- **H**. Ensure that only members in good standing vote on organizational business. The Secretary will be assisted by the Membership Chairman and the Sergeant-at-Arms.
- I. Serve as official organization correspondent.
- **J**. Keep a current folder that includes all official correspondence, records, and official materials assigned to his care and turn over the folder to his successor.

#### **TREASURER** - The duties of the Treasurer shall include, but not be limited to:


- A. Serve as an elected member of the Board of Directors.
- B. Act as Chairman of the Ways and Means Committee if the committee is necessary.
- C. Be the Chief Financial Officer of the organization.
- D. Be the custodian of all financial records of the organization.
- E. Receive and be responsible for the collection of all monies due and payable to the organization.
- **F**. Have custody of all organization funds, and shall provide for the safekeeping, retention, disbursement, and investment in a manner acceptable to the Board of Directors.
- **G**. Receive donations on behalf of the organization.
- **H**. Issue letters in acknowledgement of all donations as required by tax codes.
- I. To work with the President to make such reports and returns as are required by Federal, State and local governments, the Articles of Incorporation, the Constitution, and these By-Laws, including the disbursement of appropriate taxes and fees.
- **J**. Maintain accounts appropriate to the structure and activities of the organization and in accordance with generally accepted accounting practices and principles.
- **K**. Keep a current folder that includes all official correspondence, records, and official materials assigned to his care and turn over the folder to his successor.

#### **HISTORIAN** - The duties of the Historian shall include, but not be limited to:

- **A**. Serve as an elected member of the Board of Directors.
- **B**. Serve as Chairman of the Historical Committee if a committee is necessary.
- C. Prepare and present a report at the annual business meeting regarding the history projects completed during the preceding year.
- **D**. Keep a current folder that includes all official correspondence, records, and official materials assigned to his care and turn over the folder to his successor.





I have had a very diverse career within the federal government as well as private business and industry. My career began in 1966 when I enlisted in the Air Force. As a Security Policeman, I was assigned to the 410<sup>th</sup> Bombardment Wing, 410<sup>th</sup> Combat Defense Squadron, K.I. Sawyer AFB, Michigan; 633<sup>rd</sup> Combat Support Group, 633<sup>rd</sup> Security Police Squadron, Pleiku AB, Vietnam; and the 81<sup>st</sup> Tactical Fighter Wing, 81<sup>st</sup> Security Police Squadron, Bentwaters RAF, England. My most memorable experience in the Air Force was defending Pleiku Air Base during the 1968 Tet Offensive in Vietnam.

I separated from the Air Force in 1970 and pursued my college education while working as a warehouse manager for a pharmaceutical and hospital supply company. After graduating from Tiffin University with a Bachelor of Science degree in Criminal Justice, I made the decision to rejoin the military and entered the Army as a Military Policeman. I was assigned to the 554<sup>th</sup> Military Police Company, 385<sup>th</sup> Military Police Battalion, 18th Military Police Brigade, Patch Barracks, Germany; Headquarters U.S. European Command, Protective Service Detachment, Germany; and Forces Command, Law Enforcement Activities, Fort Sheridan, Illinois. My most memorable experience in the Army was leading protective service missions with the Multinational Peace Keeping Force in Beirut, Lebanon.

In 1987, I started my civilian career in federal service with the Department of Army, assigned as the Director/Physical Security Officer, Physical Security and Crime Prevention Division, Office of the Provost Marshal, Ft Sheridan, IL. My responsibility included facilities and installations in six mid-western states assigned to the 4<sup>th</sup> Army. In 1989 I was recruited by the U.S. Department of Energy, Savannah River Operations Office (DOE-SR). During my tenure at the DOE-SR, I was assigned as a Team Leader, Branch Chief, Program Manager, and Division Director. I managed and directed a wide range of programs to include: Physical Security, Protective Force Operations, Intelligence/Counter-intelligence, Fire Protection, Aviation, and Emergency Management. I also directed the security mission for nuclear spent fuel being transported via ocean vessels from foreign country reactors to the U.S. as part of the Nuclear Nonproliferation Treaty. After 9/11, I was assigned a collateral duty to the FBI's Southeast Joint Terrorism Task Force, CSRA Joint Agency and Midlands Weapons of Mass Destruction Working Groups representing DOE Savannah River Operations Office.

I retired from federal service in 2007 and became a consultant to both private industry and the federal government on nuclear and petroleum security, terrorism, emergency services, and aviation safety and management. I completely retired from the work force in 2012. Post retirement I have volunteered with the Augusta Historical Society working on the National Veterans History Project collecting (videotaping) personal accounts of American war veterans for a better understanding of the realities of war. Those accounts are sent to the National Achieves so that future generations may hear directly from the veterans. Greetings from beautiful Northeast Alabama! Thank you so much for your support of Sarge's Café, a non-profit organization established in 2014 in memory of Alvin W. Matthews, MSgt. USAF (retired). Sarge served in the 483<sup>rd</sup> SPS Cam Ranh Bay, 1971-1972 and later as an instructor at the Security Police Academy. He is VSPA Life Member #127. This year marks our seventh year of service providing for school children!

As you know, Sarge's Café has no paid employees. 100% of all donations go directly to providing for school children. The directors donate their time, vehicle and provide gas for picking up and delivering non-perishable foods and bottled water for school children battling food insecurity.

While the 2019-2020 school year was a challenge due to the pandemic, we persevered, and our loyal supporters continued sending their donations. We have committed to providing bottled water, after school snacks with bottled water and weekend food for the 2021-2022 school year. We remain flexible in all that we do, especially this year with potential unexpected school closings. Should that be so, our contact at Bryant School knows that we will do what we can to provide non-perishable, child friendly items if there is a need.

We returned to work August 9, 2021. Our projects are described below:

- 1. Provide 16.9-ounce bottles of water for 80 students at Lincoln Academy, Huntsville, to serve with their lunch. The cost for water is approximately \$60.00 weekly.
- 2. Provide afterschool snacks for 24 students in the Lincoln Academy's Learning Lab afterschool program. By request we are now providing chips, rice Krispy treats and gummy snacks, as well as bottled water. The lab meets Tuesday through Friday each week. The cost for snacks and water is approximately \$125.00 weekly.
- 3. Our weekend lunchbox program provides for 30 students at Bryan School, Bryant, in Jackson County, Alabama. We provide enough for 3 breakfasts, 3 lunches, and 3 dinners. The cost for weekend lunchbox food <u>per child</u> is approximately \$25.00, or a total of \$750 weekly.


### DONATIONS AND ESTATE PLANNING BEQUESTS TO THE VSPA
