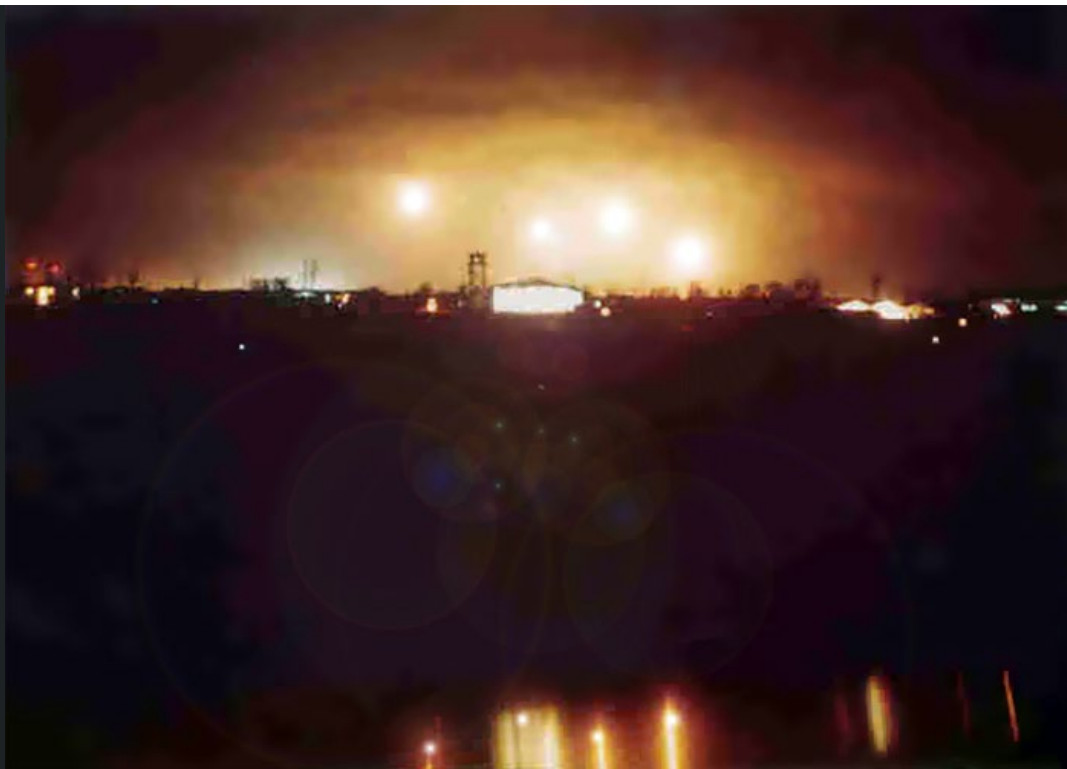

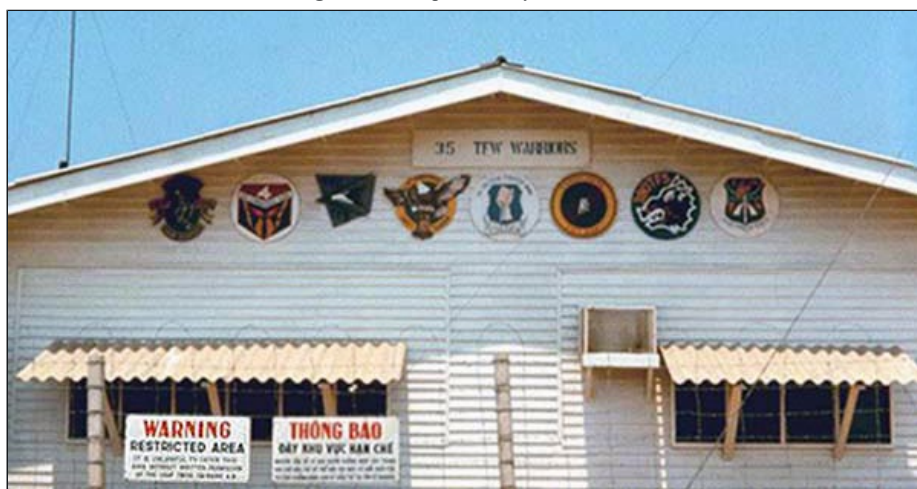

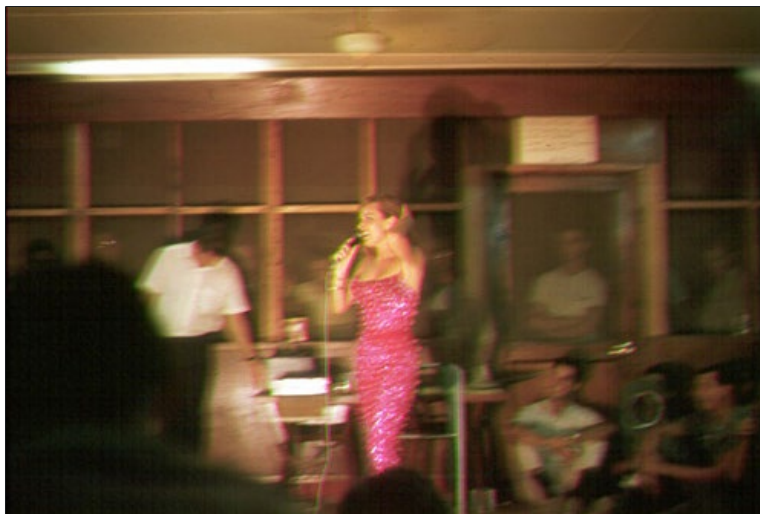

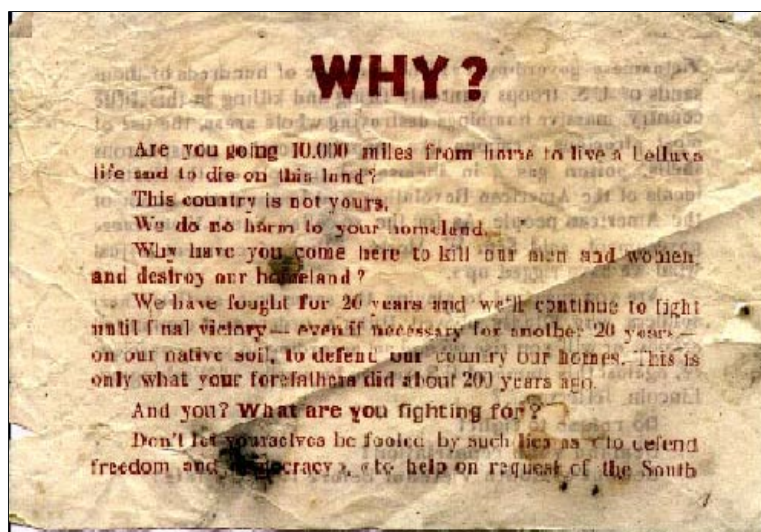

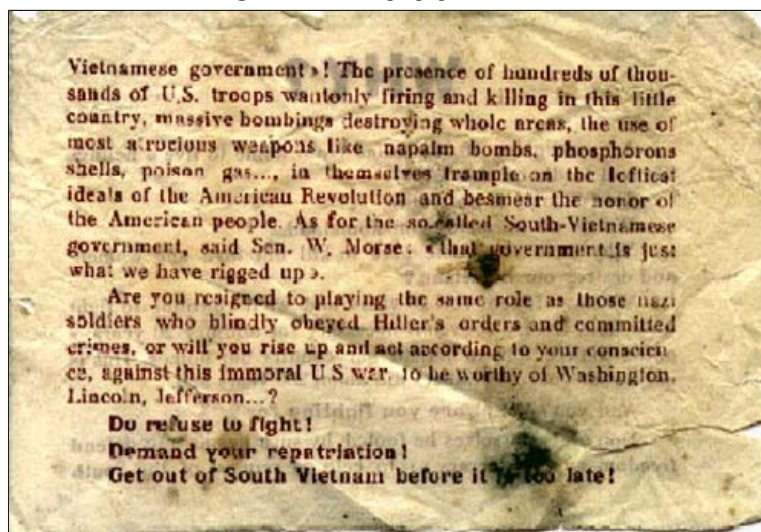

CODE OF CONDUCT THE ARTICLES	
<p>1. I am an American fighting man. I serve in the forces which guard my country and our way of life. I am prepared to give my life in their defense.</p> <p>2. I will never surrender of my own free will. If in command, I will never surrender my men while they still have the means to resist.</p> <p>3. If I am captured I will continue to resist by all means available. I will make every effort to escape and aid others to escape. I will accept neither parole nor special favors from the enemy.</p> <p>4. If I become a prisoner of war, I will keep faith with my fellow prisoners. I will give no information nor</p>	<p>take part in any action which might be harmful to my comrades. If I am senior I will take command. If not I will obey the lawful orders of those appointed over me and will back them up in every way.</p> <p>5. When questioned, should I become a prisoner of war, I am bound to give only — name, rank, service number and date of birth. I will evade answering further questions to the utmost of my ability. I will make no oral or written statements disloyal to my country and its allies or harmful to their cause.</p> <p>6. I will never forget that I am an American fighting man, responsible for my actions, and dedicated to the principles which made my country free. I will trust in my God and in the United States of America.</p>
