I am Retired Master Sergeant Luther F. Hankamer, II, USAF. Greg Hankamer was my younger brother, and I was the last of our family to see him alive. While Greg was at Nakhon Phanom RTAFB, I was at Udorn RTAFB. Greg and his wife (Dim) and new baby (Sandra) were secduled to rotate back to the states in November of 1974, but he extended an extra six months. I saw him in early December when I was getting ready to rotate. Greg Hankermer had paid me back the money I had lent to him to buy his wife's wedding ring, the week before he gave his life. I returned, what was left of his M-16 to the armory, after driving Thai Air Force and "Sea Rats" out to the site the following evening.

Bill McKelvey and I had an argument a couple nights before about me getting a line number for SSgt before him. "You'll make it on the "B" cycle, Mack!" Was one of the last words we spoke. I always understood that he did?
