POST # D-12, HEAR REVETMENT GUARD

- LINITS: The limits of your post will be the rear (or north) side of the Main Revetments 4 through 7. Remaining within 55 feet of the revetment wall.
- 2. HOURS: 04,00-2000 hours, seven (7) days a week.
- 3. UNIFORM AND EQUIPMENT: Uniform will be in accordance with APSR 35-1, equipment will be an M-16 rifle with 72 rounds of ammunition, a portable radio (if directed), steel helmet with liner, flashlight, foul weather gear if required, and the SSI for this post.
- 4. SPECIAL INSTRUCTIONS:
 - a. Your post is a walking post at the rear of the aircraft revetments.
- b. You will be especially alert for unauthorized person(s) within your area. In the event a suspicious act(s) occurs, an attempt to identify person(s) involved will be made.

(front)

- c. If attempts to identify the person(s) are unsuccessful, the guard will attempt to apprehend. If person(s) attempts to escape, challenging procedures will be complied with.
- d. Smoking is authorized on this post when you are more than 50 feet from the revetment wall.
 - e. All incidents will immediately be reported to CSC.
 - f. You will be familiar with the "Code of the Day" and its proper use.
- g. You will be familiar with and comply with the "Firearms Policy" as outlined in 2070 APSF 19(-1)
 - h. You will know and comply with the eleven (11) security instructions.
