HONORS. SERVICE STREAMERS. None

The Vietnam Service Streamer, a unit award analogous to the award of the medal and ribbon for the individual is identical to the ribbon in design and color. A United States Air Force (USAF) unit qualified for the Vietnam Service Streamer if it was based in South Vietnam at any time between 1 July 1958 and 14 November, or 29 January through 28 March 1973.* A unit based during these same periods in Thailand and flying missions into or over Vietnam also received the Vietnam Service Streamer. Nonpaying combat support units based in Thailand at any time between 1 July 1958 and 28 March 1973 are also entitled to the service streamer.

* Units earned the appropriate campaign streamers between 15 November 1961 and 28 January 1973.

CAMPAIGN STREAMERS.



A Campaign Streamer is a Vietnam Service Streamer with the name and dates of the campaign embroidered on it. With one exception, the Vietnam Air-Ground Campaign, a unit qualified for a campaign streamer if it was based in Vietnam or engaged in combat in Southeast Asia during the period of a designated campaign.

UNIT EMBLEM: 35th AIR POLICE SQUADRON

SIGNIFICANCE OF DESIGN ELEMENTS: The emblem symbolizes the mission and activities of the 35th Security Police Squadron. The four stylized figures: Sentry, Scales of Justice, Dog Silhouette and Scroll with Pen, represents the basic functions of a Security Police Squadron: Security, law enforcement, Military Working Dog and Police Administration.

The Sword with Lightning bolts is indicative of the Squadron Motto, "Ready to Serve Anytime - Anywhere", and denotes Strength, Defense, and Unity of the Squadron working together towards the ultimate mission objective, Justice, Peace, and Freedom. The colors red, white and blue are symbolic of the colors of our flag and represent Valor, Purity and Vigilance. The Golden Yellow is the official Air Force Color which indicates the Sun, and the excellence required of Air Force Personnel.

MOTTO: READY TO SERVE ANYTIME - ANYWHERE.

DESCRIPTION: On a blue disc edged with a narrow black border a Sword with Blade to base in pale (blade and guard white, hilt and pommel red, all details black) emitting from its hilt two yellow lightning bolts chevron wise to base between in the upper portion of the disc a silhouetted red Scales of Justice in dexter and a silhouetted red stylized sentry sinister and in the lower portion of the disc a red scroll garnished yellow above a red ink bottle and pen in dexter base and a red silhouetted head of a dog in profile, couped at the neck and eyed black in sinister base.

Attached above the disc a white scroll edged black and inscribed "READY TO SERVE ANYTIME - ANYWHERE" in black letters.

Attached below the disc a blank white scroll edged black.
