

Evergreen, AL Thurs., October 11, 2012 Vietnam casualty honored

An estimated 200 people attended a memorial event in honor of the late Bruce Dale Jones, an Evergreen service member who was killed in Vietnam, Friday at the Rabb Cemetery, west of Evergreen.

The 20-year-old Jones, a Thurgood graduate of Marshall High School in Evergreen, was killed on March 9, 1972 at Tan Son Nhut Airbase in Gia Dinh, South Vietnam, where he was serving as a sergeant in the Air Force's 377th Security Police Squadron. During Friday's event, members of the Vietnam Security Police Association (VSPA) and others paid tribute to Jones at his gravesite in the cemetery.

During the event, Evergreen Mayor Pete Wolff read an official proclamation from the City of Evergreen in honor of Jones. In August, in preparation for the event, the city council unanimously voted to declare Oct. 5 "Bruce Dale Jones Day" in the City of Evergreen as a way to honor Jones.

The complete proclamation read as follows;

"To All Who See These Presents - Greetings:

"WHEREAS, inherently, the City of Evergreen has recognized their native citizens for all outstanding accomplishments, but most especially those of bravery And,

"WHEREAS, it is well documented that Bruce Dale Jones was born, raised and came to manhood within the City of Evergreen, And,

"WHEREAS, Bruce Dale Jones is known to be a graduate of Thurgood Marshall High School, a school with a long and meaningful history linked with the City of Evergreen. And,

"WHEREAS, Bruce Dale Jones, elected to serve in the Armed Forces of the United States Military, enlisting in the United States Air Force in 1970, crediting his home of record to be the City of Evergreen. And,

"WHEREAS, Bruce Dale Jones lost his life in the line of duty, succumbing to wounds suffered in 1972 while serving with the 377th Security Police






