





Webster) Phù Cát perimeter Tower, outskirts of our TAOR, once used by Koreans (ROK). Note the trenches for defense. I think this was an abandoned Tower used by the ROKs. We were on many occasions very lucky, and this was the case one night at this location. Two 1041st guys were positioned at the bottom of the tower and in the trench (visible in center of photo) and no one was in the tower. During the night they heard noise coming up to their position. They popped a flare and it got stuck in the tree above them. A careless mistake which could have cost them their lives. There were several VC sneaking up to their position, and instead of getting a clear shot at them the Viet Cong ran away.
