5. Tan My, Loran Station. This is a special photo for the Heavy Weapons Project. It's a captured Russian tank from the Easter Offensive being operated by ARVN soldiers. According to Intel from MACV, the tank *didn't exist* (nor the *other one* that was captured). These soldiers were on their way to the MACV compound in Hue to convince Military Intelligence that there were in fact beaucoup tanks just up the road from where they sat. Up to that point Military Intelligence ignored field intelligence reports about tanks because Russia had *assured* the US that they had not sent any tanks to North Vietnam... and besides, if the NVA had moved a bunch of tanks to the DMZ, *Intel would surely know*. It almost cost them Hue for the second time. **1972.**
