Combat Operations After Actions Report, Tan Son Nhut AB, RVN,  
4 Dec 66, RCS: MACV J3-32 (U)

1. (U) The attached report is forwarded for your information (Atch 1).
2. (C) (C) It is our opinion that this attack is a "typical" Viet Cong combined mortar and sapper penetration attack which can be staged at any time against USAF and USAF/VNAF installations. From it we can evaluate our security concept of operations.

a. (U) We feel that the threat against USAF and USAF/VNAF installations as defined in PACAF Supplement to AFM 207-1 is accurate.

b. (C) We feel that the existing security standards as established in PACAF and 7AF supplements to AFM 207-1 provide at least the minimum security required to cope with the threat.

c. (U) We feel that the lessons learned from this attack strengthen our position against the requirement for personal protection training being included in the curriculum of training prescribed for air police being assigned in RVN. This is pointed out to USAF in our letter of transmittal.

3. (U) Problem areas discussed in paragraphs 14 and 15 are being pursued with Hq 7AF (Atch 2).

4. (U) Please return report to IGS for further dissemination to DO and DPL.
