SERVICE STREAMERS. None. Seven campaign streamers and two decorations.

The Vietnam Service Streamer, a unit award analogous to the award of the medal and ribbon for the individual is identical to the ribbon in design and color. A United States Air Force (USAF) unit qualified for the Vietnam Service Streamer if it was based in South Vietnam at any time between 1 July 1958 and 14 November, or 29 January through 28 March 1973.* A unit based during these same periods in Thailand and flying missions into or over Vietnam also received the Vietnam Service Streamer. Nonpaying combat support units based in Thailand at any time between 1 July 1958 and 28 March 1973 are also entitled to the service streamer.

* Units earned the appropriate campaign streamers between 15 November 1961 and 28 January 1973.

CAMPAIGN STREAMERS.


A Campaign Streamer is a Vietnam Service Streamer with the name and dates of the campaign embroidered on it. With one exception, the Vietnam Air-Ground Campaign, a unit qualified for a campaign streamer if it was based in Vietnam or engaged in combat in Southeast Asia during the period of a designated campaign.

UNIT EMBLEM: 8th AIR POLICE SQUADRON

SIGNIFICANCE: The significance of the elements of the proposed 8th Security Police Squadron emblem are as follows:

a. The lightning bolt cutting diagnally across the center of the emblem is symbolic of the swiftness with which the 8th Security Police Squadron responds to any calling.

b. The dragon in the lower right side is a Korean symbol which represents peace and happiness.

c. The scales of justice are symbolic of not only the law enforcement and justice system but also of the delicate relationship existing between the peaceful co-existence and readiness of response to any contingency.

d. The slogan "Vigilantia Pretium Libertas" is Latin for "Vigilance, The Price of Liberty".

MOTTO: VIGILANTIA PRETIUM LIBERTAS (Latin for "Vigilance, The Price of Liberty").

DESCRIPTION:

A disc edged with a narrow black border, the background divided per bend yellow and blue, in bend a red lightning bolt throughout between a pair of green scales above and a Korean dragon's head below (medium blue and green garnished yellow, white and black, langed red).

Attached above the disc a blank yellow scroll edged black.

Attached below the disc a yellow scroll edged black and inscribed "VIGILANTIA PRETIUM LIBERTATIS" in black letters.
