At Cam Ranh we were hit by sappers and rockets in the summer of 71. George Reavis had his camera on post and

an unknown tower rat sp was listening to a tape from home in his tower. When the dogs started alerting and calling to control he started taping the transmissions. I got a copy yrs ago and recently dug it(literally) out of the attic. I have a couple mins of it on the end of a 6 min home movie tribute the men that served and the dogs. If you were there that night better brace your self to go back in time again but it is very historic known only to a handful that were there and have passed it on for preservation. I want this to live on so people do not forget the strain and price our guys went through and we had a alot in that vast area with no fences in the jungle with about a dozen kilo units and some bumkers , towers and jeeps. Enjoy but be lerted. You also have to listen to

Sarge Joe Fuller sing a song he wrote about k9 man recorded in his hooch 36 yrs ago but not too bad quality considering. Then hold on to your seats..

We pulled back our northern perimeter for a couple days and baced for a counter attack that did not materialize. We slept in our cloths. We also refused to guard the bombed out area unkess nco went along as there were som sniper fire

coming from this burning area that broke glass miles away. I had a very rare night off that evening as the sky lit up like daylight when the naplm went...

It is important to note that a group of members who actively use the bulletin boards came up with an idea to get more members involved. They recognized very early in their discussions that not all members can afford to attend reunions, that some choose not to attend for other reasons, and that many members have limited access to their brothers in arms because they do not have computers.

The Ad Hoc Committee developed on their own as a very small group of members with an idea. As they discussed that idea within the Free Fire Zone (FFZ), it became apparent that they were also willing to do some work to take care of their own. They gathered in the FFZ with the idea that something good could come from the ideas and discussions and that they might be able to provide an opportunity to get more members involved.

Specifically, the Ad Hoc Committee began to discuss the election of officers and the selection of reunion sites which, according to our by-laws, have always been conducted at the reunions. Until now, due to limited technology and resources available to the VSPA, as well as the manpower required to do the work, holding those elections and site selection votes at the reunions was the only practical means available.

Now, we have the potential for change. We are larger and there is more technology available within the resources we have available. We also have the skill and some members, other than those who are already working at maximum capacity without compensation, who are willing to work for free, and possibly create something very good for all of our members.

All discussions regarding the ideas being addressed by the Ad Hoc Committee (elections and reunion site selection) are discussions only and are intended for the develoment of information to be presented to the Board of Directors in accordance with our by-laws. This requires work and the collection of information. It is very important to note that those discussions do not include how to manage the VSPA or how to conduct VSPA business on a daily basis, all of which is governed by our Constitution and By-laws.

Discussions being held by the Ad Hoc Committee have the potential to be extraordinarily valuable TO THE VSPA providing that they remain positive in nature. Controversy and disagreement among members that allow freedom of suggestion and appropriate consideration of ideas even though they me be discarded later, can also be very healthy FOR THE ASSOCIATION, but are not for review by students and those who continue to harbor anti-war feelings toward Vietnam Veterans. Therefore, all discussions being handled by the Ad Hoc Committee belong within the Free Fire Zone for Members Only.

While you may feel that those comments should remain within public view, do not forget that this public

board has been hacked in the past, that people who are not members and those who have never served in Vietnam or Thailand, like hackers, can pose and provide very negative, controversial input on this bulletin board FOR NO OTHER REASON THAN TO CAUSE DISCORD OR TO WATCH YOU AS YOU BECOME THEIR ENTERTAINMENT FOR THE EVENING.

The Ad Hoc Committee may make announcements on this Public Bulletin Board inviting members to the Free Fire Zone for discussion; however, the Google aspect that will preserve misunderstandings, controversy and bad ideas for years to come will also cause confusion in the future due to limited background information, especially for new members a year or two from now.

Be wise in your discussions and the messages you post on this very public bulletin board. All members in good standing are invited to discuss these ideas in the Free Fire Zone.

How to Get More Membership Involvement in VSPA Elections.

In an effort to increase membership participation in VSPA elections and encourage the number of qualified candidates seeking office, several members have volunteered to put forth a proposal to the VSPA board.

The current election process consists of electing officers at the re-unions. The candidates are nominated, seconded and give a very brief speech about their desire to serve. They then leave the room and a show of hands elects the winners. Very little is known of the candidates' abilities to govern a rapidly growing VSPA or what their visions for the future of the VSPA happen to be.

To date, we have been fortunate in our selections. However, less than approximately 15% of our members decide the elections and locations of future reunions. While the rest of the membership may agree, they certainly have no alternative if they disagree. The proposal the volunteers wish to develop and put before the board and the membership would enable all members to have some input into the selection and election of candidates and other VSPA matters which have previously been decided only by those members attending the reunions.

Suggestions to be considered would be voting by computer for members who have computers. For those who do not have computers, or cannot attend the reunion, a paper ballot would be mailed to them.

Candidates who wish to run for office can post a short resume in the Free Fire Zone and a copy enclosed with the mailed ballot. The resume would be a one page or less outline of their background, experience and generally why they are the best person for that job.

Your input or suggestions for this proposal should be posted in the "FFZ". The "Proposal for Election Changes Committee" is chaired by Pat Houseworth, and includes Don Poss, Sam Lewis, Mark Brooks, Bill Marshall and Newell Swartz. Comments for suggestions are welcomed. More to follow!

Don: I called Tom Baker, x skycop from Da Nang AB, K9, 1965-66, and tentmate. Tom is in the VA hospital, a double-amputee, Agent Orange Type II diabetes, and a host of health problems. Prognoise is not good

Hello Donnie. I gotta tell you I appreciate so much all them letters, pictures, and cards I been getting' from all over the country. Detailed information on everything to! I'm not a scrapbook kind'a guy but I gotta tell you I got me one now.

Don: [Tom sounded tired, medicated, exhausted, and talkative. He is worried about the future and if there will even be one. He is worried for his wife.]

How's the VA treating you?

Tom: This VA has done nothin' but right by me now. Still having a weight problem. I thought when they took my one leg I would lose weight even if it was the hard way. But the medication and all I quickly gained back even the weight of my missing leg. Then they took the other one and the same thing happened....

Don: [Tom, as a double-amputee, weighs over 400 pounds now]

Tom: ...But the VA is doing alright. We had a couple of run in's but I got'em straightened out now and they don't mess with me. Old x skycops are like badgers and you don't wanna rile'em up. VA's treatin' me right. One of the surgeon's came in and wanted to know if I was interested in a wheelchair conversion van--first time anyone ever asked a question with the thought that I might get out of here. He told me about the van and I told'em I didn't want no van that would cost me three times what my house did—can't afford it. And the doc said he thought he could help with that. Next thing I know my wife is drivin' a 2007 conversion van—brand spakin' new—and we can afford it, and it is set up so's I can even drive it. I just can't believe it. Maybe I will get out of here someday, one way rather than the other.

Done a lot of travelin' in my work. Nobody has called me. No bosses. No workers. Nobody. And then all a sudden I get calls from old skycops I don't even know. And they talks to me like we are old buddies, and we tell what we did and the crap that was goin' on just like we was there in the war together. We was there alright, maybe years apart, but we are there together now, and that's what counts I guess. I'm tellin' ya it just makes me feel so good. Chokes me up to, I gotta admit.

I talked to a lot of K9 guys and they talk about their dogs. This dog's handler was ... rather than other way around ... and that's kind'a funny, but I do it to. You know, like, Blackie's handler was Donnie, haha. A couple of the handlers knew some of the men I knew, like Colonel "P" (Phillips). Did I tell you how he roped me in to K9 at Da Nang? He called my ass in to CSC one day and said that I was the only school trained K9 in the squadron, at that time. We had about 200 men in the squadron total back then, and I think it was eleven hundred by the time we left. We only had the 12 or 13 dogs and I think ended up with 48. Anyway, Colonel "P" wanted to know why I wasn't in K9 already, and I said there weren't no dogs and I didn't bring one with me and I was doin' just fine. And Colonel "P" said that I wasn't "doin' just fine" or even close and the next time he heard that my sorry'ass came crawling through the main gate smellin' like a brewery that my sorry'ass would wake up in jail at Clark Air Base.

Don't know how he knew about that, but he knew about all of us somehow. He then told me as of now I was in K9 and was gonna help train all them OJT'ers how to handle dogs—and not only that I was gonna have my sorry'ass and all the OJT'ers out on post with dogs at 2000 hours tonight! Colonel "P" could be kind'a stubborn about things until he gets his way—unless of course, he says, you want your sorry'ass to wake up at Clark Air Base tomorrow morning! By miracle of miracles, none of them new handlers got bit. I enjoyed working for Colonel "P", but there was a hell'a'lot of dummies between him and us.

Donnie, if you recall, our 8-man tent had 16 men in it. And it was too dang hot to sleep when we got off duty. And those C-130's turned their butts toward us and blew all that red dirt at us and we was caked red with sweat and dirt. I thank God for those aircraft going through their engine warm up though, cause we never would'a got no sleep from all the snoring in all those tents.

We had some school kids come through here the other day, and they was a talkin' to us vets and asking us questions. One kid was kind'a quiet and he said his daddy was really sick and not doing well. He was a Vietvet from somewhere but I don't remember where. And I really felt sorry for that young boy and his daddy.

Don: [I couldn't help but think that Tom Baker was laying in bed with both legs amputated and weighing over 400 pounds from medication and his condition, and yet there he was feeling compassion for a young boy and his father.]

Tom: Steve Gattis called me. We talked about Jackie Kay's plane crash where he got hurt. We talked for quit a while to. Nice man.

Don: By the way, don't worry about your VSPA membership, it's taken care of and you are current.

Tom: I don't know what to say. That means a lot. Please tell all the guys I really enjoy their calls and all the letters and cards. I better go now and get some rest.

Don: So long, Tom. I'll pass on your phone number again.

PS: Tom Baker's cell is 620-660-1859. Give him a call and if he doesn't answer he will definitely call you back, and he will leave you feeling good.
