- \underline{DO} give help and cooperation to the other Americans and Allies who are here assisting the Vietnemese people.
- PO consider carefully the VC tactics before making decisions which affect the lives and property of the Vietnamese people.
 - DO treat WC captives according to the Geneva Convention.
- <u>DON'T</u> forget where you are and why you are here. Always use self restraint and consciously avoid any actions which would discredit our notives and weaken our standing with the Vietnamese people.

DON'T use unnecessary force.

III. <u>CONCERNING YOUR PERSONAL CONDUCT</u>:

- DO keep your appearance up to proper standards.
- DO know and obey Vietnamese and U.S. regulations dealing with purchases from the BX and commissary and conversion of currency.
- DO call the Military Police when involved in an accident in which someone is injured or the property damage exceeds 1000 piasters (\$9.00).
 - DO remember security and remain alert,
- $\underline{D0}$ cooperate with the Vistnamese National Police -- they are responsible for your security.
- DON'T let yourself become irritated by inconveniences or differences from your usual pattern of life.
 - DON'T walk in large groups in the city.
 - DON'T travel alone at night.

LOCAL TRANSPORTATION

Local transportation service in the Tan Son Nhat - Saigon area presents many inconveniences and delays.

a. Commercial taxi's are plentiful except during rush hours and rain storms. Vietnamese drivers usually speak French and broken English. Therefore, it is advisable to retain a map of Seigon with you at all times. Vietnamese cabs cost approximately 50 - 100 plasters for the ride into Seigon/Cholon. Recommended prica is 50 plasters. At night, the cabs are authorized to charge double after 2200 hours. You should pay no more than 100 plasters. Most taxi drivers will not use or do not have neters, so be sure to agree upon a price before hand. Should the driver try to charge you more after reaching the destination, request assistance from a Vietnamese National Policeman. Always maintain proper courtesies in dealing with the Vietnamese. The following Vietnamese phrases will help you communicate with the drivers:
